



## Admissions, Tuition, and Fees 2026-2027

Summit Christian School admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to the students of the School. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national or ethnic origin in the administration of its educational policies, admission policies, scholarship and loan programs, and athletic and other school administered programs.

### Application Fee

A *non-refundable* \$100 per student application fee is due at the time of application.

### Registration Fee

A \$350 *non-refundable* registration fee per student is due before registration is complete.

### Re-Registration Fee

To reserve a seat for the 2026-2027 school year, the *non-refundable* \$200 re-enrollment fee and Enrollment Packet must be submitted in the FACTS Family Portal by February 28th; after this deadline, a \$150 late fee will be applied, and **classroom availability cannot be guaranteed**.

### Programs

Summit Christian School offers elementary and middle school programs for students in K5 through eighth grade. Students receive instruction in Reading, Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, History/Social Studies, and Bible. Students also participate in daily devotions, weekly chapel, Music, STEM, Art, and Physical Education. Co-curricular experiences are provided for students of all ages and can change from year to year. Elementary and Middle School students also have a variety of athletic programs available to them.

### Tuition

\*Tuition payments, if paid monthly, are due on the first day of each month. The tuition cycle runs for 11 months, from July 1<sup>st</sup> through May 1<sup>st</sup>.

### Textbooks

Summit Christian School provides all student textbooks.

### Field Trips

Classes at Summit Christian School participate in a variety of field trips related to the curriculum. The trips and fees vary per grade level and are billed to parents.

### Parent Service Hours

Parents must complete a minimum of five (5) hours of service to the school per year per child, with a maximum of ten (10) hours required per family, or pay \$150 per child or \$300 per family.

Our SOAR Program for Students with Outstanding Academic Results, and our Cultivate Program for students needing additional classroom support are available for an additional fee.

Our program is not a special education program. Rather, it is a program to support students with disabilities and learning differences in compliance with Section 504.*

### **Additional Payment Plan Fees**

We are pleased to offer payment plans for families for expenses that would normally be considered incidental expenses. We hope these plans will help simplify family budgeting.

**A \$30.00 late payment fee will be assessed for tuition received after the 10th of the month. A \$30.00 fee will be assessed for returned checks/reversed debits, or insufficient funds.**

**\*\*\*All families are required to have a FACTS Tuition Management account where billing is processed for tuition and incidental expenses. There is a yearly \$55 fee for this service.**

### **Financial Aid**

Financial aid is determined after April 15<sup>th</sup> each year and requires the previous year's tax information.

- a. **Need-Based Financial Aid** – Financial aid may be available based on need. Application may be made at <https://online.factsmgt.com/signin/3V16S>. Under normal circumstances, Summit does not offer more than a 50% scholarship for financial assistance.
- b. **Step Up For Students** – The Florida Tax Credit Scholarship provides scholarships for K-12<sup>th</sup> grade students in the state of Florida based on income. Families may visit [www.stepupforstudents.org](http://www.stepupforstudents.org) for more information.
- c. **Family Empowerment Scholarship Unique Abilities (FES-UA)** – The Family Empowerment Scholarship (Unique Abilities) are available through Step Up for Students for students with specific learning disabilities and clinically-diagnosed medical conditions.

**Financial Obligations:** Accounts must be current for a student to attend classes, receive a report card, and have records released. Once an account becomes 30 days delinquent, the student is subject to dismissal. Upon withdrawal or dismissal, the student's records (except medical) will be held until all financial obligations are paid. No deductions or refunds of tuition will be made for withdrawal, absence, or dismissal. In cases where a student is enrolled during the school year, tuition is prorated on a quarterly basis.
